Governor Gilliam Holds Capital Press Conference

At the Press Conference, Governor Gilliam centered on the Focus Act, which allows all public schools of higher education representation in the Tennessee Board of Regents. Currently, six schools are not allowed representation with the state of Tennessee. These schools are the University of Memphis, Middle Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University, East Tennessee State University, Austin Peay State University, and Tennessee State University. The Governor noted that the setup is currently making it so that students cannot vote because they are not capable of voting. She is very adamant that "students know student issues" and therefore should have representation on the board. Gilliam acknowledged her efforts in lobbying at state legislature meetings in support of this act. It was noted that the Legislators agreed that there should be representation for all public college students; however, not much action has been taken by these legislators.

Regarding the resignation, Governor Gilliam believes that this is the best option given the scenario. She is happy with Nick Lembo's resignation speech and his leaving with dignity. When asked about her nomination for governor, she acknowledged that James Mathew Wyatt of Union University has made her "very impressed and has full support."
